6. Maintenance Requirements

· The product should be checked on a regular basis for damage or wear and tear - this includes flaking or cracking paint. Should damage be evident, then the user should refrain from using the product until advice has been sought from the supplier. Any undue signs of damage should be noted and reported to the supplier in the first instance.

7. Warning

- This product is not intended for users more than 190 kg/30 stone in weight.
- The manufacturer recommends that the equipment is used to support bed entry and exit form the side of the bed
- · Always use webbing straps if equipment is being used to aid entry and exit from the bed from the opposite side the equipment is being used from.
 - We recommend a full risk assessment should be carried out before use.

8. Warranty

As manufacturers we cannot specify expected product life as this is based on the level of usage however we can advise that this product has been designed, manufactured This product carries a 12 month warranty from the date of purchase against manufacturing defects. It is strongly recommended that the user exits and enters the bed on the same side of the bed the equipment is fitted to, if using the equipment from the opposite side of the bed to which the equipment is fitted – always use webbing straps. 3. Assembly Instructions

- Carefully unpack and examine the product to ensure that all parts are present
- Before use check for any signs of damage e.g. cracked weld, flaking of paint, bent tube. If there are any signs of damage please refrain from using the product and contact your supplier
- If the product has not been packed ready assembled, assemble the Bed Aid by sliding the two sections of the assembly together (telescopic action)
- After inspection align the holes in the frame, ensuring they are equally aligned on both sides
- Push the pin clip in the hole ensuring it is fully engaged (protruding from the opposite side it was pushed into)
- Ensure the pins are located properly before the product is placed under the mattress
- Place the Bed aid under the mattress with the grab handles facing upwards, ensuring that the product is secure and if required fit straps. The Bed Aid is now ready for use.


4. Correct Use

- The Bed Aid complies with current entrapment guidelines
- These Bed Aids are suitable for various types of bed construction but specific risk asse
- Do not attempt to overload the Bed Aid (see section 7)
- IMPORTANT: Do not sit or stand on your Bed Aid; it is designed for use as a transfer support in and out

Lift Ease Straps:

The safety straps are standard on the B540 and B550 and optional on the B54 & B55 to reduce movement under heavy use. Straps are recommended and can be ordered separately if required for the B54 and B55.

which the frame is fitted, there are two methods in which the straps can be attached to the bed. It is the responsibility of the person fitting the straps to ensure the most appropriate method is used to ensure the frame is as secure as possible Figure 1 shows how the straps attach to the Lift Ease frame at the corners. 






Please note: 2 straps maybe joined if required for larger beds

For both methods of fitting, the straps should attach to the frame at the corners and should be pulled tight before use. The tightness of the straps and security of the bed frame should be regularly checked.

5. Cleaning

- It is recommended to use mild detergent with warm water to wipe down framework on at least a weekly basis more frequently if required.
- Do not use an abrasive cleaner as this will damage the frame and nullify your warranty

Use of power/jet washing & industrial washing machines:

- If either of the above is used to clean equipment care must be taken since high-pressure water can be
- Care should be taken that frames are not placed too close to high-pressure water jets.
